Kim A. Margolin, MD, is Professor of Medicine at the University of Washington in Seattle and a member of the Division of Clinical Research at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center. Previously, she was a staff physician in medical oncology and bone marrow transplant, GCRC Research Subject Advocate, longterm IRB member and acting Associate Director for Clinical Research at the City of Hope National Medical Center in Duarte, California. She also chaired the City of Hope's Scientific Review Committee. Dr. Margolin participated in the Oncology Drugs Advisory Committee between 1994 and 2000 and is currently serving as the chair of the Cancer Education Committee for the American Society of Clinical Oncology.

Dr. Margolin has extensive experience in leading, coordinating, and participating in multi-institution trials of immune-response modifiers as one of the original members of the National Cancer Institute's contracted Extramural IL-/LAK Working Group and a current leader of the Cytokine Working Group (CWG). She is also an active member and former at-large director of the Board of Directors of the International Society for Biological Therapy of Cancer and is currently conducting a number of research projects related to treatments for melanoma.

Dr. Margolin earned her BS at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA) and completed her medical education at Stanford University in California, housestaff training at Yale and fellowships at UC San Diego and City of Hope in medical oncology and bone marrow transplantation.
