




Background – Cancer Immunotherapy and the Patient Experience

Understanding the Patient Perspective

- Where does the interest of the patient intersect with the needs of science?
- How do patients define benefit and value?
 - Non-exchange based
 - Patient value = patient values
 - Communication with health care team
 - Community with others experiencing the same diagnosis

Understanding the patient perspective

- What does survivorship mean with a chronic disease?
- Side effects that differ from what others impacted by cancer have experienced before
- Long term psychosocial impact

Evolving Hope and Purpose
